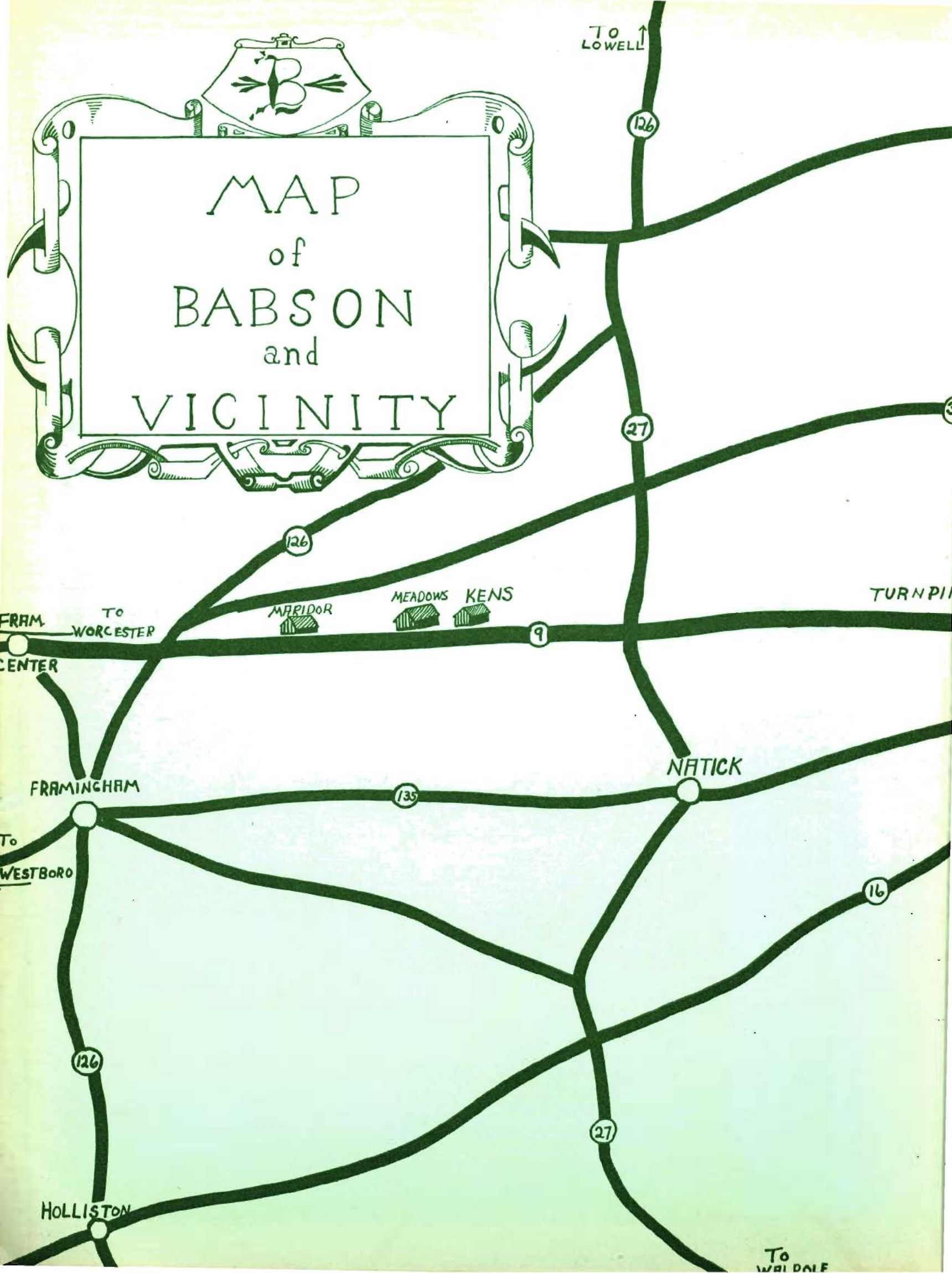

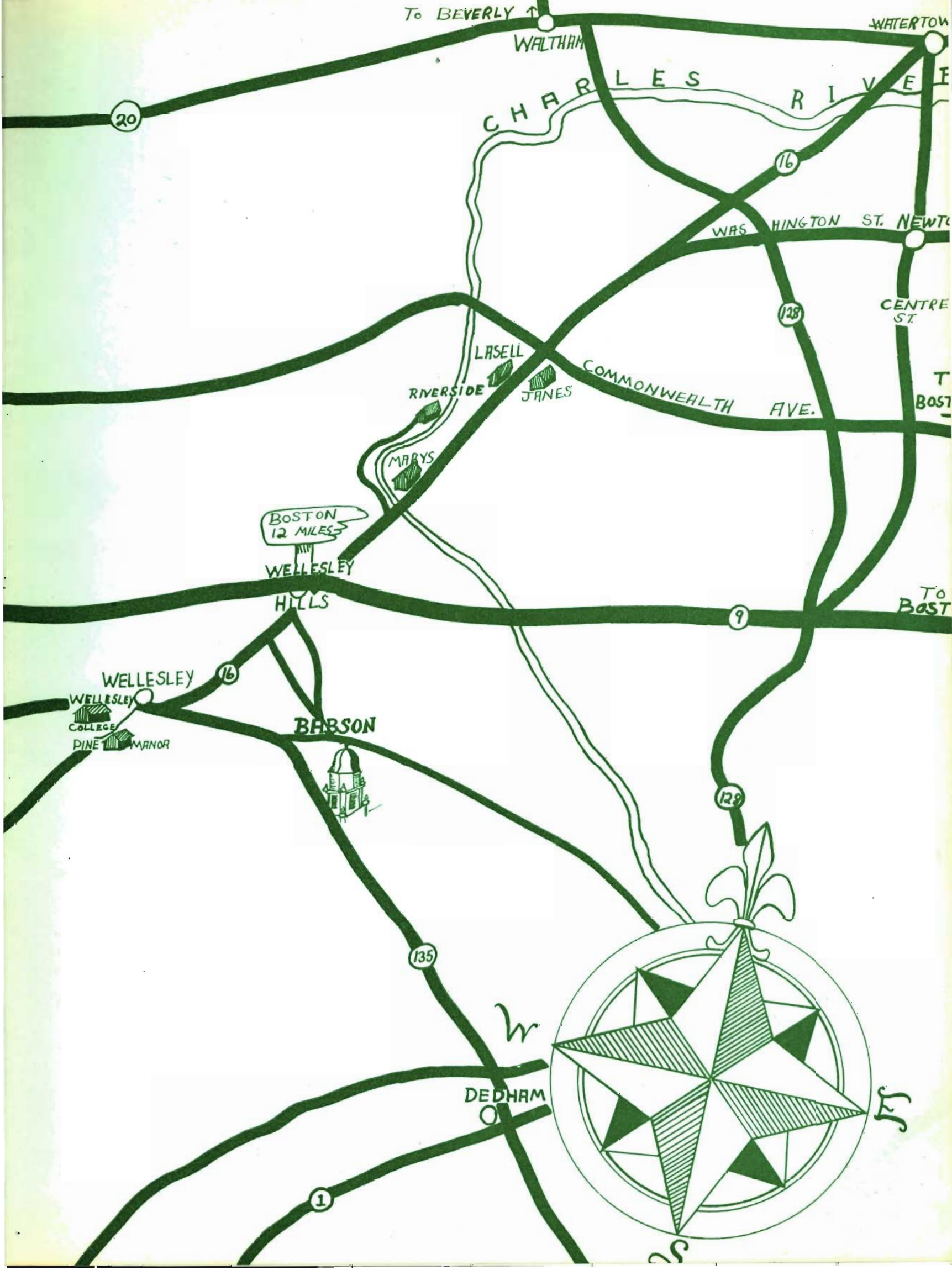

1934 thru 1941

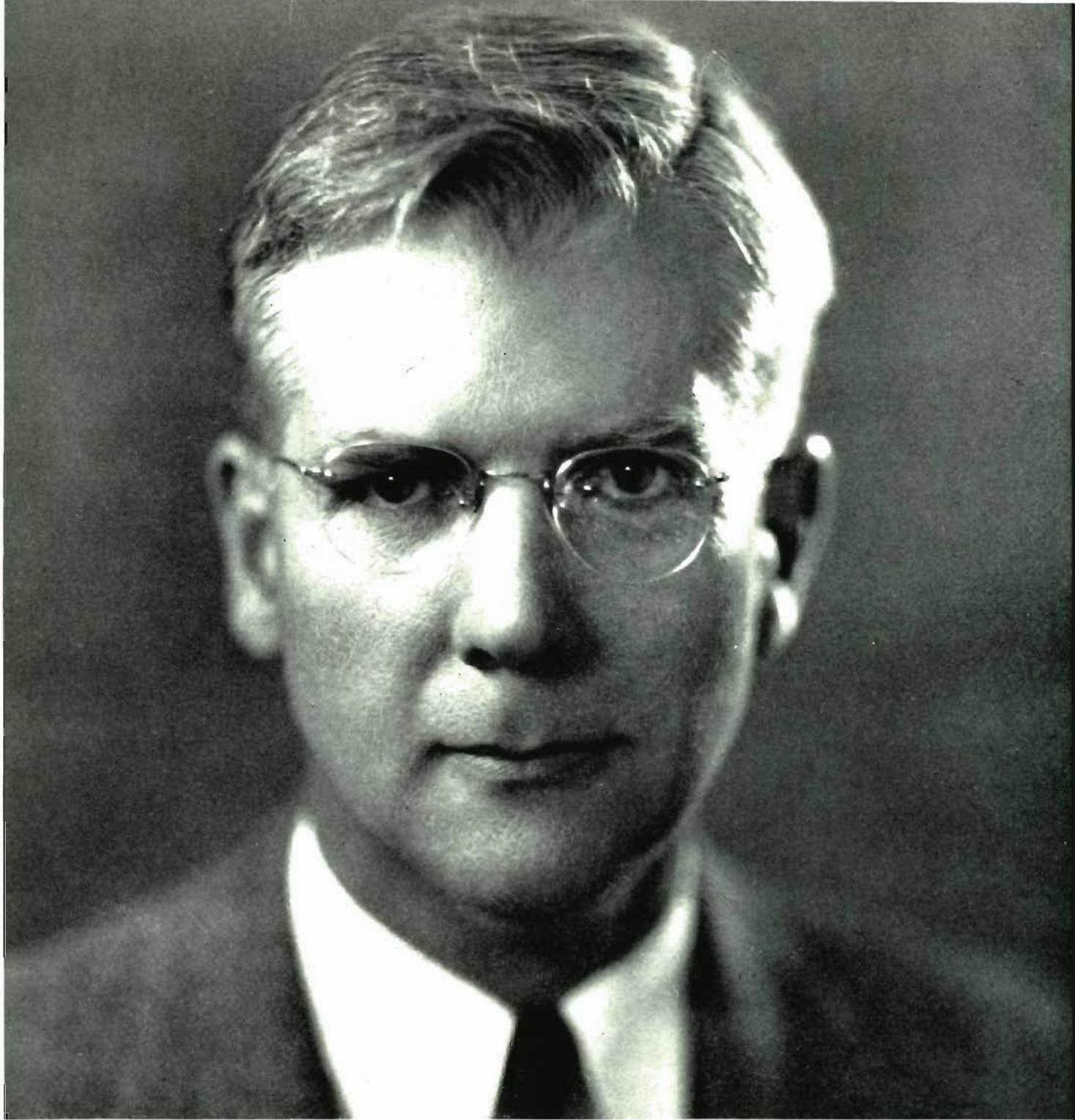

Dr. Hinckley, in the short time he has been with us, has most successfully led the school from a war time to a peace time basis. He is well equipped for this position by virtue of his experience both in education and in industry.

Under his direction many new additions will be made to the campus. Among them are the skating rink and the swimming pool. The curriculum is being improved and enlarged, and the faculty has likewise increased its numbers. Among his other ambitions for the Institute and its student body is to know and be friendly with all the students and to thank them for their loyalty and friendliness.





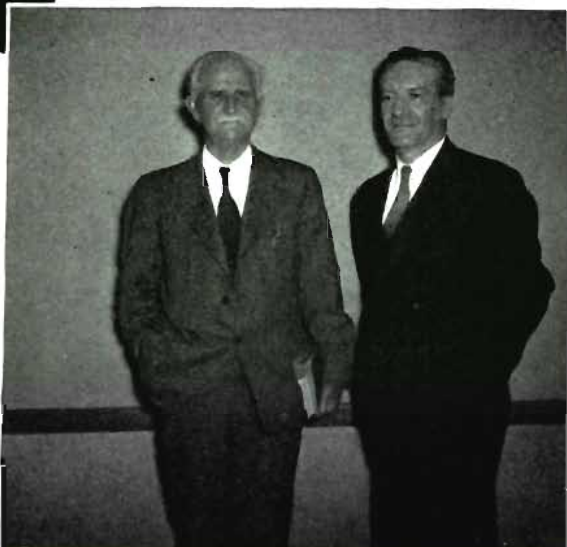

Attention is given not only to the educational and the social at Babson—emphasis is also given to the spiritual. Improvement mentally, physically, and spiritually is the aim of the Institute. It was toward spiritual improvement that the Babson Hour was instituted in 1921. It was headed first by Mr. Babson, then by Reverend Carl M. Gates, Edward Reighard, and Charles Butler successively. Immediately after the war Mr. Babson again took charge until Chaplain William Blough's services were engaged.

Although Mr. Babson is the most popular speaker, several members of the faculty have donated their time and talent to the program. The program, led by one of the students, consists of prayer, hymn singing, scripture reading, and the address. The meetings are informal; members of the group are given the opportunity to ask the speaker questions. Not only is the group composed of students, but also of friends and parents of the students or friends of the faculty. The Babson Hour is designed to give the student an appreciation of the businessman's need for prayer and devotion.

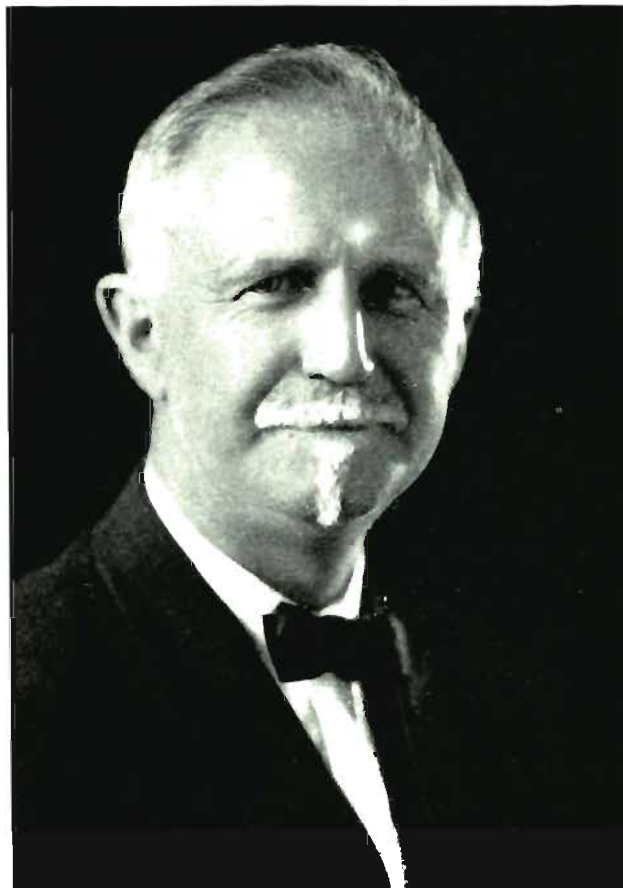
TO THE GRADUATING CLASS OF 1948:

In the 1850's before the Civil War, the colleges of New England sent large numbers of their graduates to the Central West, especially to Kansas and Nebraska. This was so they might vote against slavery, when those territories would be attempting to get full statehood. Most of these graduates and their young wives went there, not to make money, but to assure a sound foundation for the new Central West. They wanted it settled by intelligent people of character who would start good homes, schools and churches.

These people suffered hardships. They were forced to build mud houses, break virgin soil, and in many cases cut through the forests. They had no conveniences; there were no roads nor utilities; no schools and only a few doctors. They were true pioneers; but the descendants of those who stuck it out are now the backbone of our great Central West with its wonderful farms, industries and cities. Our entire nation owes more than it can ever repay to these pioneering families.

Today a similar opportunity is offered to you graduates. The time is coming someday when there will be a World War III and some of our large cities will be destroyed. At that time the East will be in chaos with transportation, communications, roads, etc., cluttered with refugees. The great Central West will be called upon to reorganize the country as well as to feed it. The future of America will depend largely upon the character of the people who then live in the six states of Nebraska, Kansas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, Missouri, and Iowa. Are you ready now to go out and again do what your grandparents did seventy-five years ago? I sincerely hope you are.

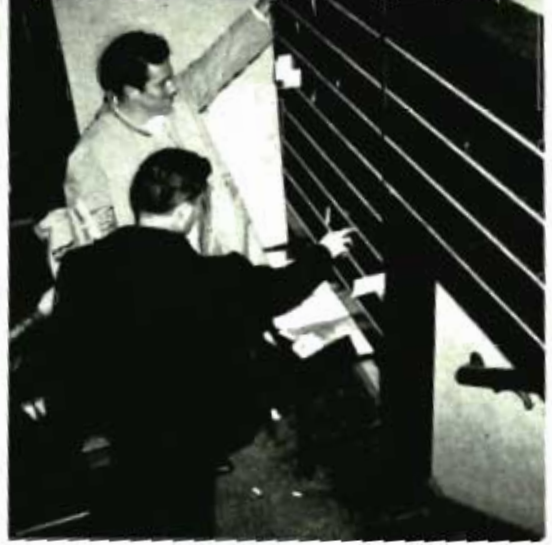
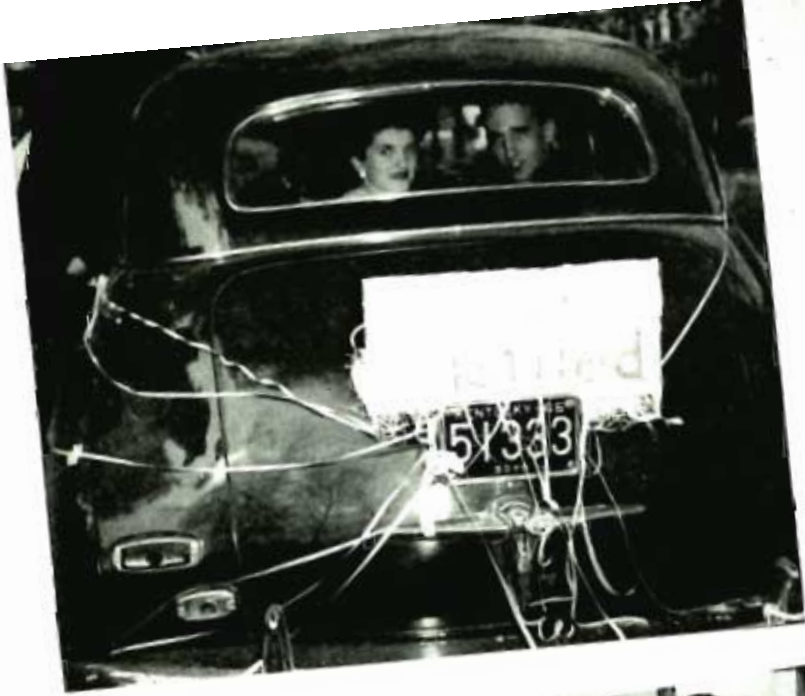
"Queen for a Night" was a great success and the student body hopes that it will become an annual event. Its continuation will be a notable addition to the social life of the school.

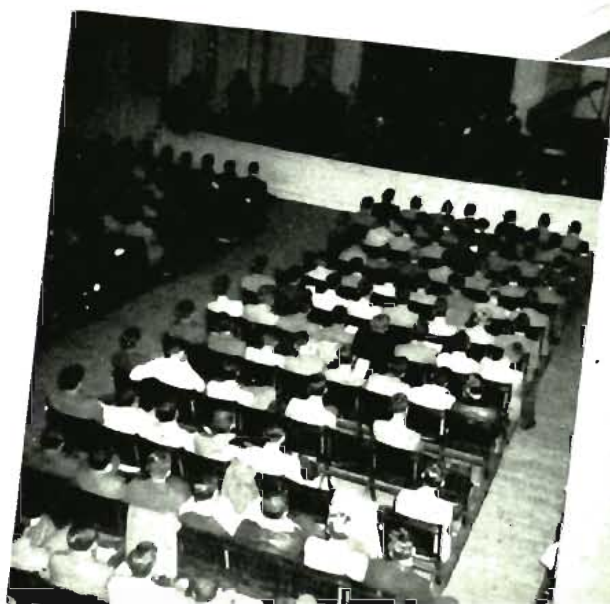
FOUNDER'S DAY

An innovation to the Institute in 1947-48 was the establishment of a Founder's Day program. The idea was originated by a group of students, and the program was held in Knight Auditorium on the morning of November 14, 1947. The unique feature of the initial program was that the founders of the Institute were not only honored, but were present and were participants. Both Mr. and Mrs. Babson told of their purposes in founding the Institute, and Mr. Babson added several notes of warning as to future conditions against which students should hedge.

Speeches were rendered by Mr. Austin Fittz, Vice-President and member of the first faculty; Dr. George Coleman, President Emeritus; Mr. Myron Pierce, Chairman of the Board of Trustees; Mr. John K. Horner, Dean of Faculty; Mr. Ashton Goddard, President of the Babson Alumni Association; Mr. Henry Tinney, President of the Student Council; and Dr. Edward Hinckley, President of the Institute. Gifts expressing the gratitude of the students, faculty, administration, and alumni were presented to the founders.

The Babson Glee Club and the Wabins rendered several songs, two of which were composed by Mr. John Montgomery of the faculty. It was the initial public appearance for these groups and for the two songs, and therefore set another precedent. The audience was comprised mainly of the student body and the guests of the students and the faculty. The ceremony was recorded for future reference.

The program was designed to express the gratitude of students and faculty toward Mr. and Mrs. Babson. It also presented an opportunity to express gratitude toward others who were instrumental in the success of the Institute in its embryonic stages. The Founder's Day ceremony exemplified the growing influence of Babson Institute in the field of education.





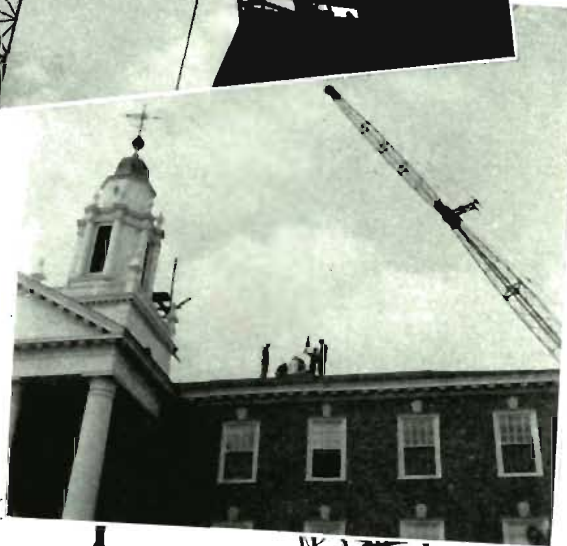
THE BELL

At the time that the Library was planned and built, there were hopes that at some time in the future there would be a bell placed in the tower, and that the students would be able to hear its tones. This thought was foremost in the minds of the administration, and the time of acquisition was left open to the future.

In June of 1947, Mr. William C. Hotchkin presented the Institute with a bell to be placed in the vacant tower of the library building. The beautiful bell that was installed in the tower weighs fifteen hundred pounds and is about forty-two inches in diameter. This bell was selected for its exceptional tonal qualities, and is a much needed and welcome addition to the campus here at Babson.

The bell is being used for the beginning of the Sunday evening vesper services and other special events on the campus. In the near future it is to be used to signify the start and the finish of each class period during the day.

The whole school is very grateful to Mr. Hotchkin for his kind thought in the donation of the bell as an addition to the campus life here at Babson Institute.



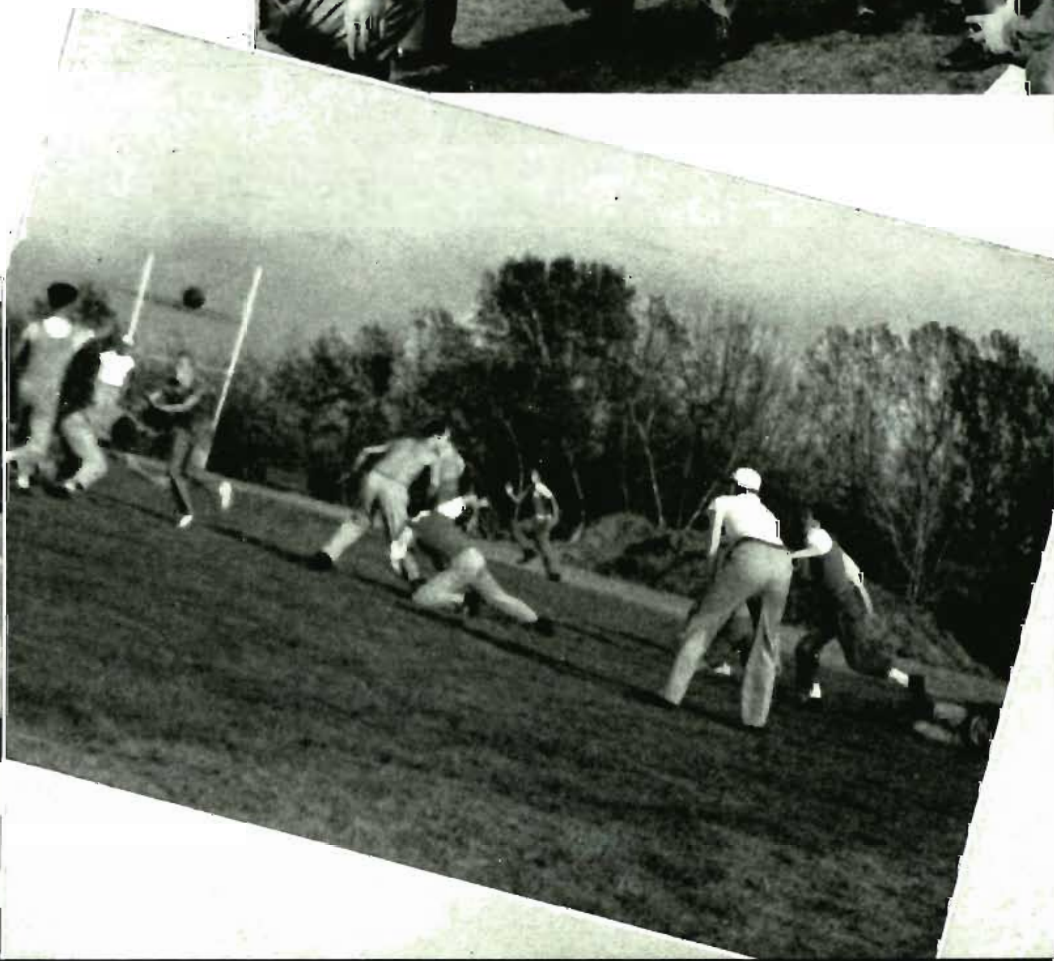
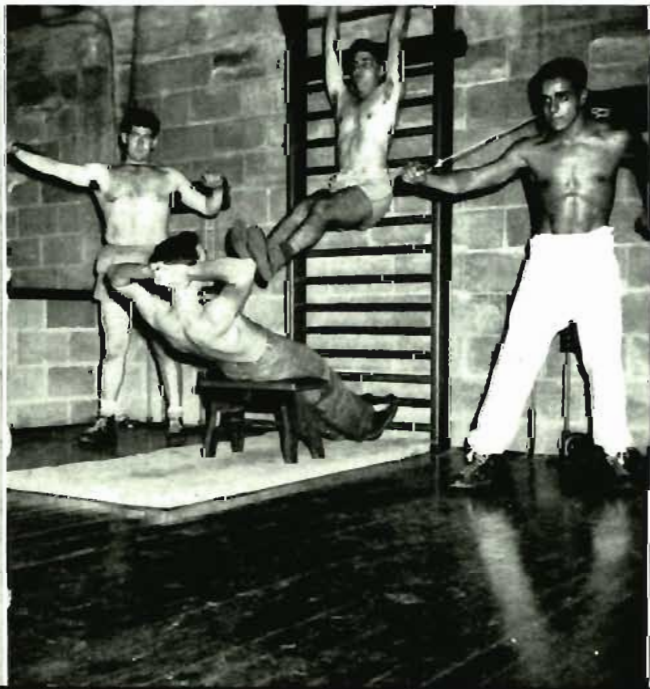

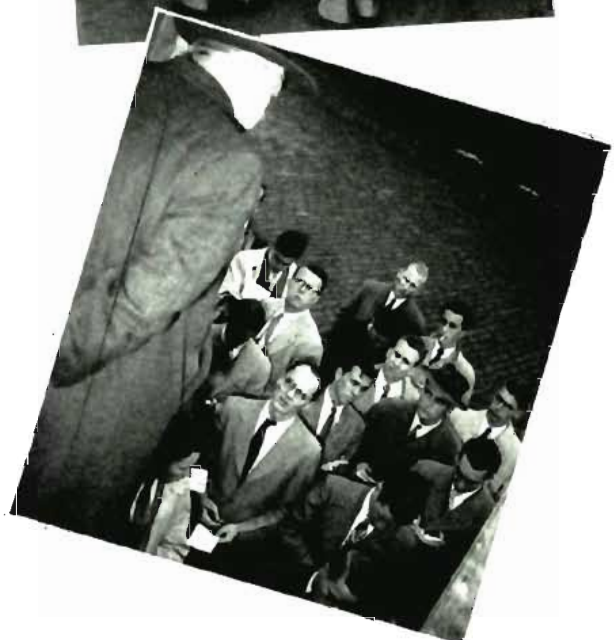
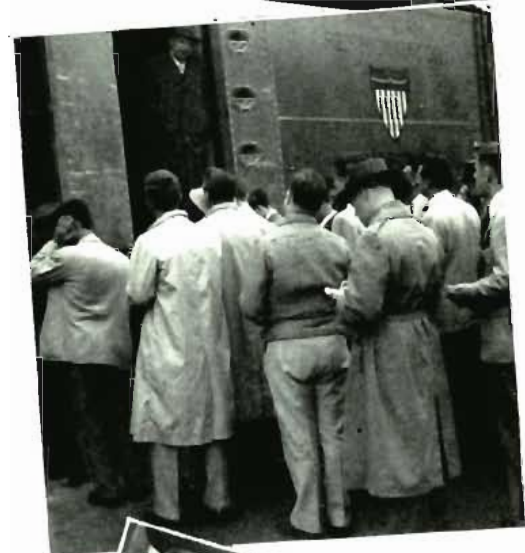
FIELD TRIPS

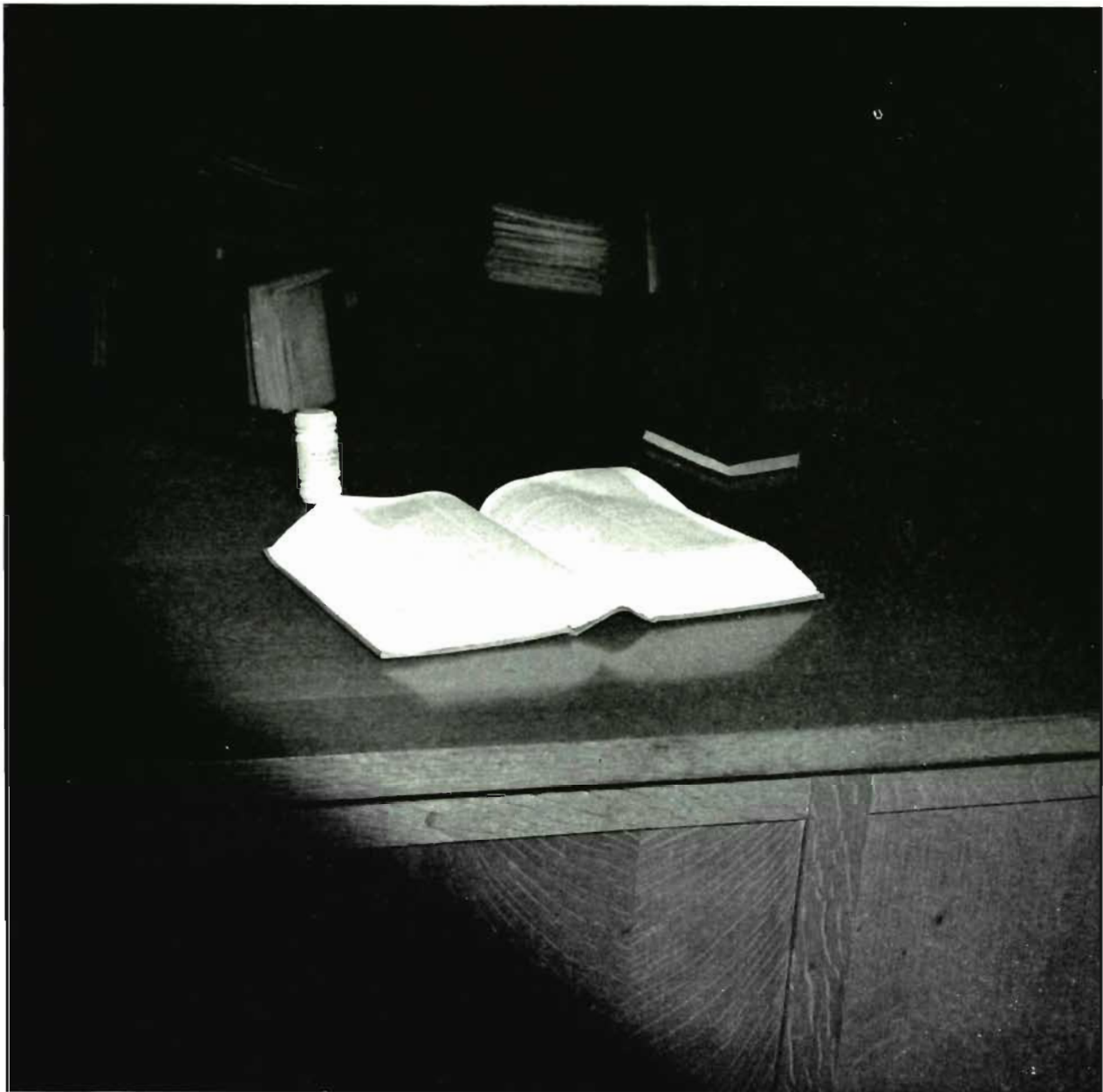
Field trips are designed to supplement the student's class-room work. By seeing actual business in operation the student learns much more rapidly. Another advantage is that he hears from the officials of the various companies visited, thereby giving him an outside and first hand approach to the business world. This method of educating the student is not only very practical, but gives variety to the instruction and allows the student to retain much more of what he has learned.

After these field trips, the student is required to make a written report to the instructor on what he has observed. Class discussion also follows in which the theory is applied to the practical experience the student has just had.

Among the greater Boston establishments visited are department stores, chain stores, wholesale establishments, retail specialty stores, and railroads.

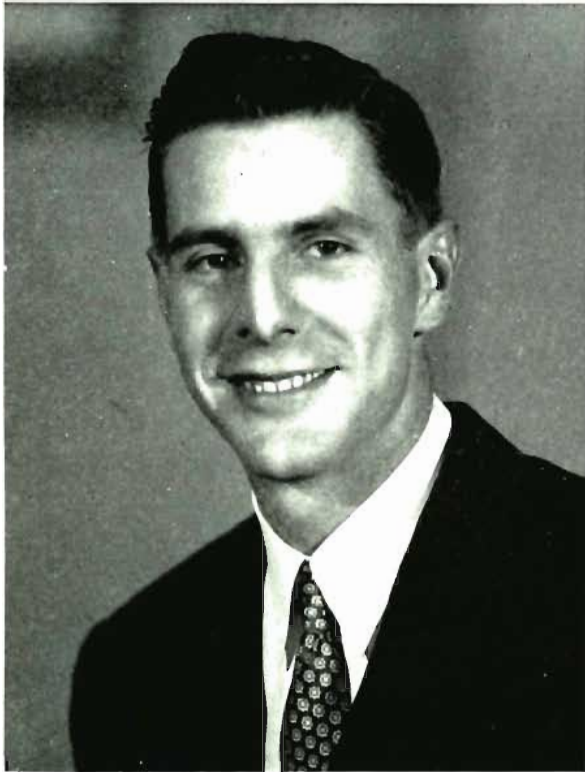

The Student Council is composed of nineteen members, one from each of the sixteen classes plus the Editor of the Beaver, Chairman of the Athletic Committee, and the Editor of the Babsonian. These men were elected by their classes as representatives, and are entrusted with the performing of the intermediary position between the student body and the faculty, as well as promoting and directing all student activities.

Three committees constitute the nucleus of the Council. They are: the Executive Committee, under the direction of Henry Tinney; the Finance Committee, headed by J. Oliver Schmidt; and the Social Committee, led by Joseph Delaney. Any activity or function that pertains to Babson life falls under the supervision of one of these three committees. It is the duty of the committee members to insure the student body that all undertakings will be successful.

This year the Council made two amendments to the by-laws: (1) All financial matters must be submitted to the Council in written form, and (2) all students desirous of undertaking selling activities on the campus must gain the Council's approval. A new school ring to be worn by graduates receiving a degree was also approved.

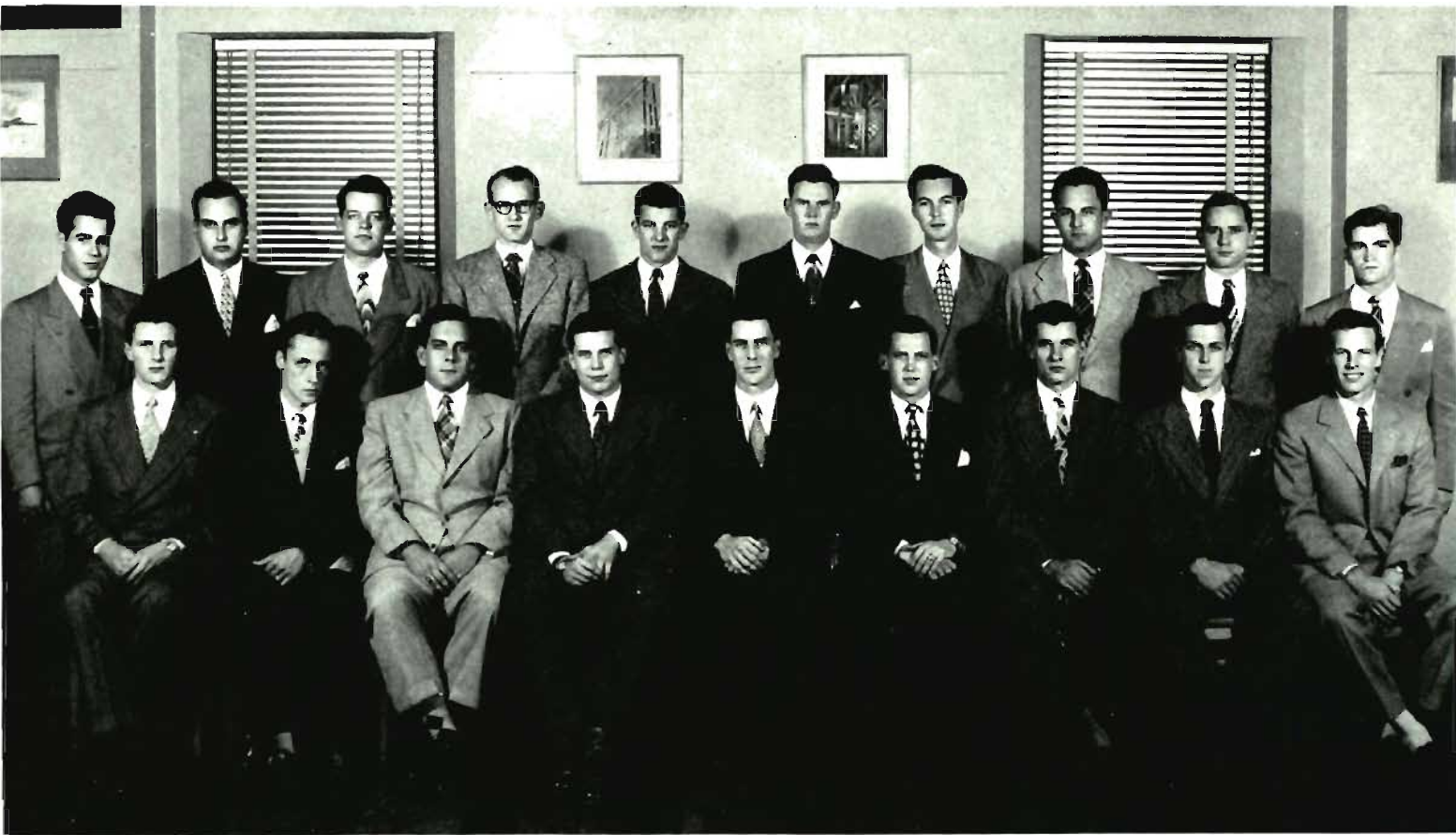
A new form of representation was followed this year. Previously, Council representatives met informally with their class and requested suggestions or ideas which could be developed in order to make school life more complete and enjoyable. Instead of this method, a questionnaire was distributed to each student asking for reactions on various important issues and allowing ample space for additional proposals. These questionnaires were then tabulated, and the Council members acted upon the results. This procedure insured the rights of the student body, and proved to be a more efficient and democratic system of student government.

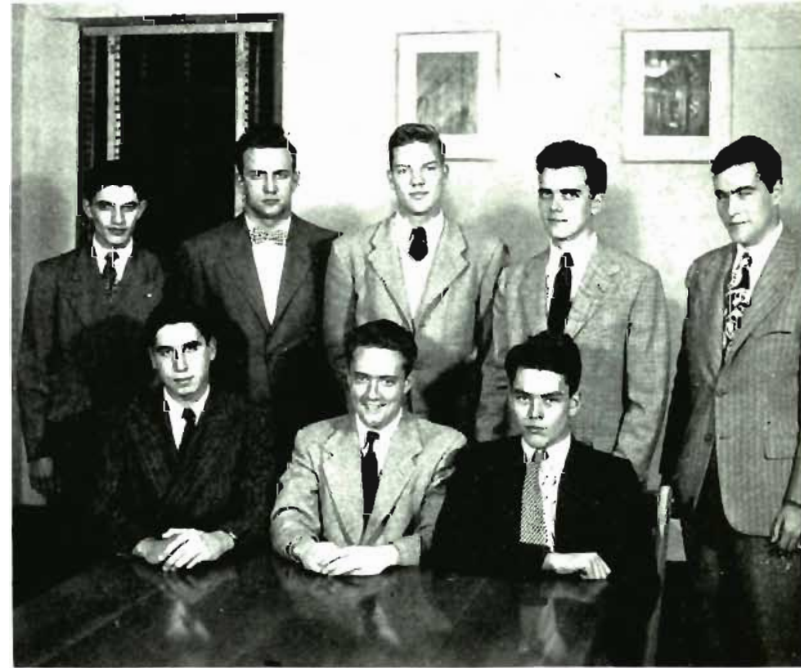
DRAMATIC CLUB

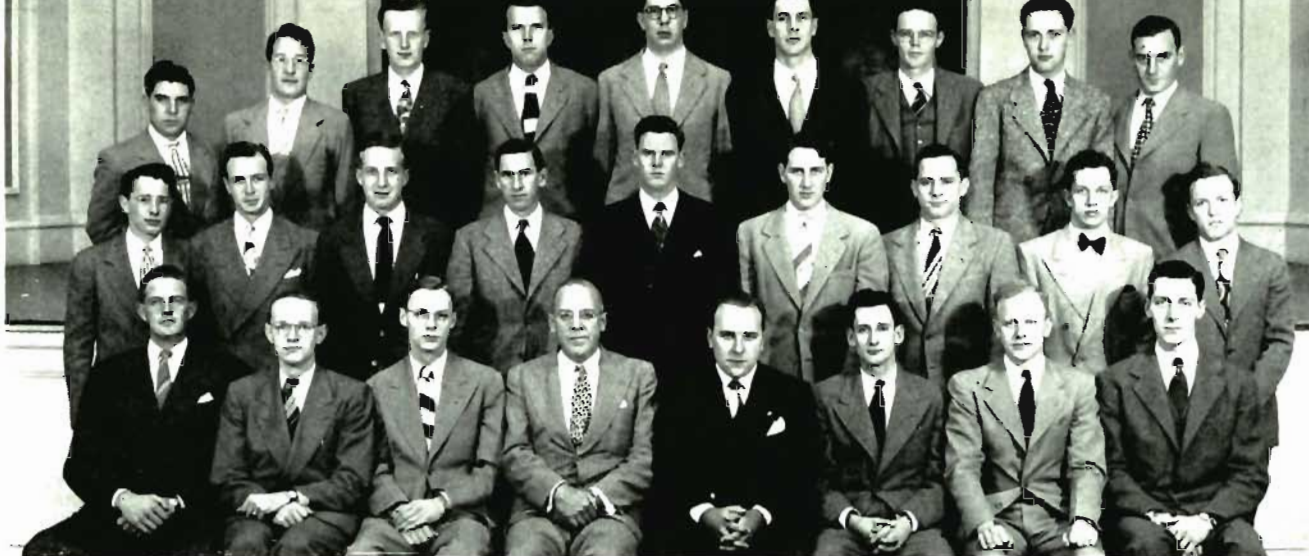
DEBATING SOCIETY

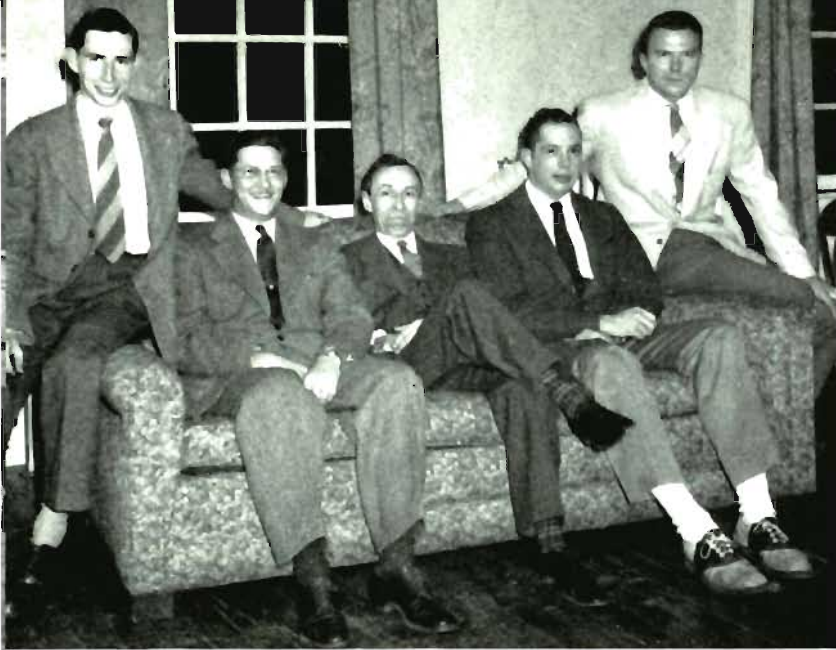

Opportunities for technical, business, production, and announcing experience are offered to students who are interested in this field.



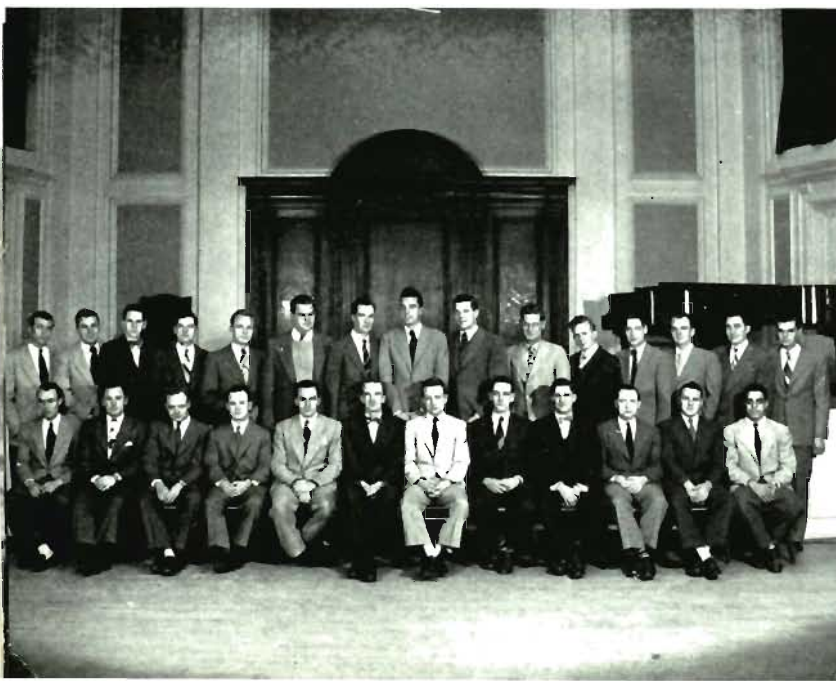

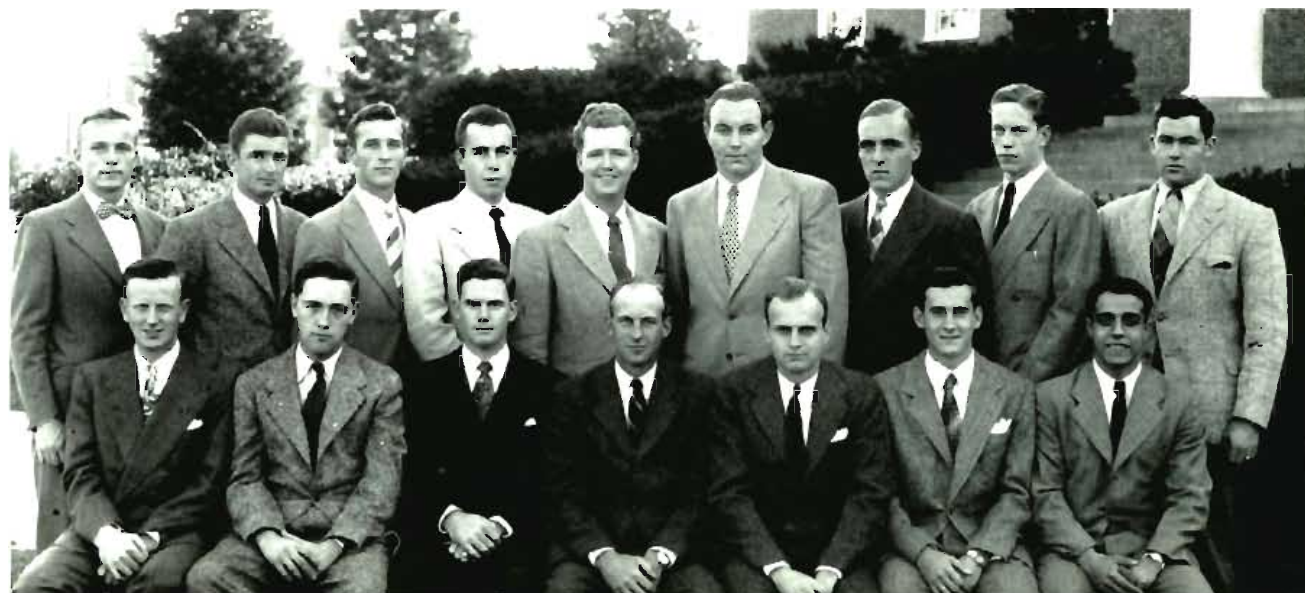
ATHLETIC COUNCIL

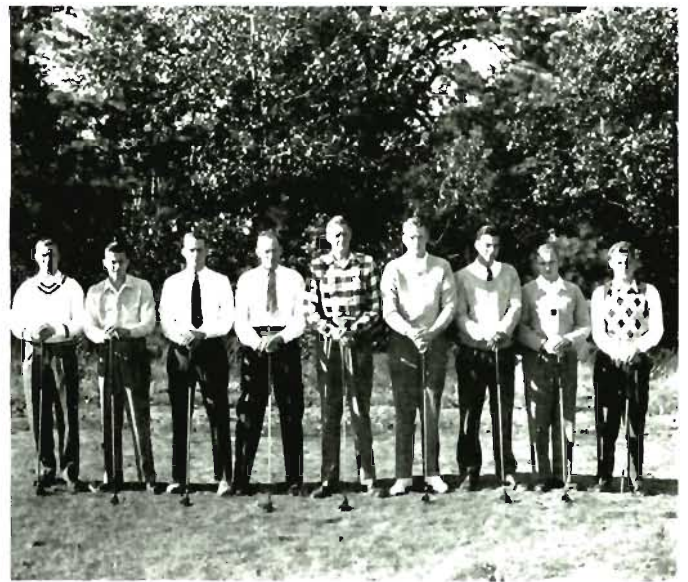
