

57% increase in the total international student enrollment over the past 10 years.






In the first-of-its-kind ranking, Forbes recognized Babson as the top U.S. college for international [UG] students in terms of quality, student population, programs of interest, and more.

#### International Students at Babson College





#### **International Student Enrollment by Program**


