This program will help entrepreneurship scholars gain a better understanding of the landscape of entrepreneurship research including the history, methodology, and research opportunities. Over three weeks, you will receive coaching and mentoring from Professors Candida Brush and William Gartner as well as top entrepreneurship faculty and peers, and you will leave with an actionable six-month work plan that will enable you to submit a finished paper to a journal for consideration.

His expertise spans a wide array of topics in the entrepreneurship field, including entrepreneurship as practice, the social construction of the future, varieties of value creation and appropriation, "translating entrepreneurship" across cultures and countries, the demographics of entrepreneural families, and the nature of legacy in family entrepreneurship.

HOW IT WORKS >>>

Entrepreneurship educators and researchers interested in applying will complete a short questionnaire regarding their status, research published, present summary of research in progress and why they want to attend the program. Applicants also will need to provide:

- CV (All materials must be submitted in English)
- >>> Working paper or paper proposal

Upon submission of paper, participants will acknowledge support from the Babson Fellows Program for Entrepreneurship Researchers at Babson College.

The program consists of a series of live sessions over the course of three weeks, optional weekly office hours with the faculty, and asynchronous collaboration. Live online dates include: Monday, September 27, 9–10:30 a.m. EDT, Thursday, September 30, 9–10 a.m. EDT, Monday, October 4, 9–10:30 a.m. EDT, Thursday, October 7, 9–10 a.m. EDT, Monday, October 11, 9–10:30 a.m. EDT, Thursday, October 14, 9–10 a.m. EDT, and Friday, October 15, 9–10:30 a.m. EDT. **The application deadline is July 15, 2021.**
