### **Hot Off the Press**

Edward Elgar Publishing has just released *The Life Cycle Of New Ventures – Emergence, Newness and Growth* edited by **Candida G. Brush**, Entrepreneurship, Lars Kolvereid, L. Øystein Widding and Roger Sørheim. Elgar says: "The contributors to this book provide a cross-national comparison of venture emergence, newness and growth. Their chapters examine the influences of cultural, social and economic factors on venture development, compare the approaches of entrepreneurs who move from idea to emerging organization, and investigate acquisition and development of resources in growth and performance." ### **Funding Guidelines**

## Babson Faculty Research Fund (BFRF)

### **Funding Goals:**

The BFRF supports a wide variety of research activities to sustain, enhance, and renew the intellectual vitality of faculty and to increase the public visibility and academic reputation of the College and its faculty, regionally, nationally, and internationally.

#### Areas supported:

The BFRF invites proposals for research that are designed to result in publications.

### Eligibility:

The BFRF shall consider only proposals by full-time, tenured or tenure-track faculty members on a current contract.

#### Funding categories:

Course releases, summer stipends, and funds for research-related expenses.

# Glavin Council of Chairs (GCC)

#### Funding Goals:

The Glavin Chairs support research that fits their mission to raise Babson's reputation for international and global management.

### Areas supported:

Research should be aimed at the international management community and preference will be given to papers that have relevance for present or future practitioners. In general, initial stages of work on a new project are not funded.

### **Eligibility:**

Normally, the Center shall consider only proposals by full-time, tenured or tenure-track faculty members on a current contract.

### Funding categories:

Funds for a project, a course release, or a summer stipend.

## Center for Women's Leadership (CWL)

### **Funding Goals:**

CWL supports research relating to the current status of women in business/leadership roles and historical research on women who have had an impact through their leadership roles.

### Areas supported:

CWL supports research that will eventually result in articles, books, or conference presentations.

### Eligibility:

All faculty, adjuncts, lecturers, and executives in residence are eligible; visiting faculty are not eligible.

### Funding categories:

Release time (course release) – generally to complete the final stage of an ongoing project; research-related travel expenses to collect data; conference presentations – travel, registration, etc.; and stipends – seed money to jump-start or investigate new research projects
